A Child's Garden of Verses

• Set of 8 pieces based on poems by Robert Louis Stevenson.

My Shadow

- o Features:
 - The question-answer subject between the hands
 - Legato and staccato
 - Echoing dynamics

Through the Windowpane

• Set of seven pieces based on poems by Robert Louis Stevenson.

Night (no.4) ... *and Day* (no.5)

- Two pieces featuring different times of the days
- o Night: D minor
- o ...and Day: F major
- o Features:
 - Smooth phrasing between the hands
 - Use of pedals
 - Rubatos

Intermediate level:

Once Upon a Journey

- five early intermediate pieces
- includes a short performance guide and a few suggestions
- an activity page

A Place to Dream

Features:



- alternation between a 4/4 and 5/4 meter.
- falling broken intervals on the right hand
- Requires good control of touch
- voicing in the hidden melody

Students can learn:



- Running note patterns
- The waltzlike style

Grade 2: Moon Flute

Students can learn:

- The chromatic harmony (block chords and broken chords) on the left-hand
- Some contrapuntal phrases
- Change of mood and tempo

- Composed in the style of a 1980s pop ballad. Students can learn:
- The syncopated rhythms
- The clear playing on the 16th notes

Grade 5: Foggy Blues

From Ikeda: "In a small jazz club hidden away in a basement, a woman on stage starts to quietly sing, accompanied by a soft piano. Outside, a deep fog sits, while footsteps on the stone pavement stop to listen to heartfelt blues."

Imitate the style of Gershwin and William Gillock. Students can learn:

- Use of pedal
- The jazz style
- rubato

Hong Kong

- is currently known as the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China
- was established as a colony of the British Empire since 1841
- Hong Kong society reflects Chinese traditions, such as cultural values and festivals, while also adopting a Western democratic style of government.

Composer: Julie Kuok Pun-Man

- Steinway artist active in performance, composition, and music education Hong Kong-born and based. Graduated from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, and the Royal Academy of Music in London
- a faculty member at the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, and the Hong Kong Baptist University

The Fantasy of Little C 小詩的奇幻旅程十首鋼琴小品

- composed in 2017
- a set of 10 pieces about the adventures of a little boy called Little C.
- Descriptive titles by using four-character idioms that start with one to ten
- a mix of contemporary Chinese and Western styles
- "Two Kids on Horseback" was selected as one of the set pieces in the 2019 Hong Kong Schools Music Festival
- suitable for students at intermediate to early advanced level



Characteristics





5.The Father, the Son, and the Fivecharacter Quatrain 五言長城



uses the key signature of G-flat major and pentatonic scale with G-flat as the center.

Students can learn:

- 1. the use of finger pedaling
- 2. playing on the black-key areas.
- 3. the contrapuntal writing.

The Father, the Son, and the Five-character Quatrain is a conversation between Big G and Little C about writing a poem for Little G-flat. The five-note patterns represent the structure of Chinese poems.

Students can learn:

- 1. bring out the scattered fragments, like a brainstorming conversation.
- 2. contrapuntal writing.
- 3. use of fermata, ritardando, and the changing tempo.

6.Huanted 六神不安



Haunted is about Little C staying at a temple for a night, and he is scared of the mysterious atmosphere there. The repeated notes illustrate the unstable heartbeats of Little C.

Students can learn:

- 1. atonal writing
- 2. playing the running notes quietly
- 3. the running repeated notes with dynamic changes.


7.Gabbling of the Spirits 七嘴八舌



Gabbling of the Spirits is about Little C finding himself surrounded by strange creatures.

Students can learn:

- 1. the coordination between both hands.
- 2. cross hand movement
- 3. the crispy and even touch
- 4. control of dynamics.





The Pride and the Pomp describes Big G showing off his martial art technique to protect Little C. The heavy chordal writing is written to represent Big G's power.

Students can learn:

- 1. the changing time signatures.
- 2. playing the rich and heavy chords by using the arm and upper body

9. Beyond the Clouds 九霄雲外



Beyond the Clouds is about Big G turning into a statue of Guan Yu and Little C hears a voice from a Goddess, Nuwa.

Students can learn:

- 1. expressive and dreamy playing
- 2. use of three staves.
- 3. pedaling

10. Finale 十全十美



In *Finale*, Little C wakes up and finds out everything was just a dream. The piece is made up of melodic fragments from the previous 9 pieces.

Students can learn:

- 1. the different styles and techniques from the previous pieces.
- 2. the dramatic shift of moods.
